

## **Introduction to Website Publication of the first tranche of Institute Working Papers in honour of Sally Ball**

We are proud to initiate our programme of website publication of Institute Working Papers with a first tranche of papers published in honour of Sally Ball. Dr Sally Ball is fondly remembered in the Oxford Law Faculty as a young law teacher and scholar of outstanding achievement and promise. Having recently completed her doctorate and been appointed to a CUF Lecturership and Tutorial Fellowship at Trinity College, she died suddenly in October 2001 at the age of 34.

In May 2002 a memorial colloquium in honour of Sally Ball, on the subject of “Constitutionalism and Employment Policy in European Union Law”, was held in Oxford, under the aegis of Institute of European and Comparative Law, with the kind support of the firm of Clifford Chance; it was largely concentrated upon Sally’s area of interest in EU Law in general and EU Employment Policy in particular.
